Eighth Valerie Fund Center Brings Comprehensive Medical and Psychosocial Services to Children and Families on Long Island

he Valerie Fund is excited to announce that it has opened its eighth center, allowing it to help more children and families than ever before. The new center, located at Stony Brook Children's Hospital on Long Island, opened on August 3rd.

The new TVF Center will serve an urgent need on Long Island. Currently, Stony Brook Children's Hospital has the only Pediatric Hematology/Oncology Program providing services to the half million children in Suffolk County, as well as those in neighboring Nassau County. The division currently handles over 5,000 outpatient visits annually, split between oncology and hematology visits. Over the last four years, it

has consistently seen 60 new oncology patients per year, a 50% increase in numbers of newly diagnosed oncology patients.

Opening a Valerie Fund Center at Suffolk County's only children's hospital means patients and their families will benefit from the mission of treating the whole child and caring for the whole family, close to home.

Laura Hogan, MD, Chief of the Division of Pediatric Hematology/ Oncology at Stony Brook, serves as the Director of The Valerie Fund Center at Stony Brook Children's Hospital. She says, "It is an honor to have the opportunity to work directly with The Valerie Fund. My team and I are beyond grateful for the generous and strategic commitment to enhance the psychosocial support for our pediatric hematology/oncology patients and their families. We are excited about what we can accomplish together."

Neil Yaris, Chairman of The Valerie Fund's Board of Trustees, echoed Dr. Hogan. "We are thrilled to welcome Stony Brook Children's Hospital as our newest Valerie Fund Center. In doing so, an additional 500 children each year will have access to the full range of psychosocial care that our other seven Valerie Fund Centers currently provide. We look forward to a long relationship with Dr. Laura Hogan and her entire team."

The new Center will significantly expand the services available to Stony Brook's pediatric patients and their families by funding a:

- Social Worker
- Educational Liaison
- Child Life Specialist
- Survivorship Coordinator
- Psychologist

These additional resources will greatly enhance the services that will be provided by Stony Brook Children's. The psychosocial toll cancer can have on a young patient can be devastating. It is essential to have continuous, ongoing care providers to address these issues after the acute phase, ultimately providing improved psychosocial health over the long term. With the additional services now funded by The Valerie Fund families will be better able to focus on the medical needs of their children, as well as the needs of other family members.

Carolyn Milana, MD, Physician-in-Chief and Chair of the Department of Pediatrics will oversee the new Valerie Fund Center along with Dr. Hogan. Dr. Milana says, "We are delighted about our new relationship with The Valerie Fund. We are grateful to be partnering with an organization that is so closely aligned with our mission of providing individualized care close to home."

This year I'm especially proud to share the news that The Valerie Fund has expanded its impact and footprint by partnering with Stony Brook Children's Hospital to establish our 8th Valerie Fund Children's Center. This new children's center in Suffolk County, Long Island will ensure full time psychosocial support for thousands of Long Island families with children fighting cancer and blood

disorders. This initial five-year \$3 million commitment to fund five psychosocial programs at Stony Brook will surely support these kids well beyond this initial term. It brings The Valerie Fund model to eastern LI so their kids can survive and thrive and have the full complement of psychosocial care they deserve.

This year also saw our Valerie Fund kids get their chance to go back to a live, in person Camp Happy Times for the first time since 2019. And we even brought kids from Stony Brook too! Our scholarship program expanded for the 12th straight year as we awarded 124 scholarships totaling almost \$500,000 to our college bound students. And our emergency funds supported dozens of families that needed some extra support as they struggle to move forward while caring for a child with cancer, sickle cell or thalassemia.

2022 has been magical for our kids with our center and program expansions. I am thrilled to say that all this now happens "for 6,000" of the bravest kids we will ever know because of YOUR support and belief in making a difference. Help us do even more for our children and families from LI to NYC and throughout New Jersey by supporting our mission before 2022 turns the corner.

participated in a 100-yard dash, where The Learning Experience's mascot, Bubbles, waited to congratulate them.


