EXPANDING HEMATOLOGY CARE AT THE VALERIE FUND CENTER AT GORYEB CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

r. Christopher Lawlor joined The Valerie Fund less than a year ago, but is already making a huge impact on care for our Valerie Fund patients. His goal is to provide world class medical care for children and the whole family from start to finish. We are excited to announce new funding for Hematology programs at The Valerie Fund Children's Center at Atlantic Health System Goryeb Children's Hospital with a new full-time Hematology social worker and a fulltime Hematology nurse navigator.

Care for children with blood disorders can be complex. At Dr. Lawlor's Valerie Fund Children's Center at Goryeb Children's Hospital, they care for pediatric patients with chronic and complex blood disorders like hemophilia and other bleeding disorders, clotting issues, sickle cell disease and more.

They will allow us to further advance the world class care that we are already providing for patients here, as well as increase our ability to reach out to new patients and participate in new innovative care."

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Having a full-time hematology social worker and nurse navigator will add to the care of Valerie Fund patients. First and foremost, these two new positions will enable the Center to better serve the children with blood disorders currently being treated. It also enables the Center to engage in community outreach, to reach all patients including those in previously underserved areas. Patients and families may not realize what the center provides and what the full scope of the psychosocial services are, that being the hallmark of The Valerie Fund.

The hematology social worker will help patients better manage complex disorders that require chronic care and often medications. Blood disorders such as Sickle Cell Disease and Hemophilia are chronic diagnoses. These patients need to be cared for lifelong to help them maintain good health and achieve their goals and potential.

The nurse navigator will help facilitate the multiple layers of specialty care that blood disorder patients require from the different specialists evaluations and procedures required to maintain health. This role will coordinate access to transportation for appointments, follow up with patients pre and post appointment and create educational materials in different languages.

Having these new positions supporting the lifelong diagnosis of a blood disorder will help give the patients the education and tools necessary to help them transition from pediatric to adult care.

The addition of these two new positions continues our efforts to help Dr. Lawlor expand the program and increase access to new medications, new clinical trials, and innovative therapies and opportunities for patients.

Dr. Lawlor is passionate about providing the best care possible for patients. Exuberant and energetic, and with an exciting vision for the future at The Valerie Fund Children's Center at Goryeb Children's Hospital. Dr. Lawlor is breaking down barriers to care and expanding access to treatment and we are excited to support his efforts.

LETTER FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Year 47 of The Valerie Fund supporting over 6,000 kids fighting cancer and blood disorders is shaping up to be another incredible year. We continue to expand our impact in all eight children's centers from New Jersey out to Long Island. We've committed over \$250,000 in new funding to expand the hematology programs and educational support at Morristown and St. Joseph's. This

brings our total psychosocial program support to almost \$4 million across the centers.

Our scholarship program expanded again. This year we awarded 132 scholarships and over \$530,000 to encourage our courageous teens

to expand their frontiers and continue their education at colleges and universities from New Jersey to Florida to California. Camp Happy Times picked up where it left off pre-pandemic to provide another amazing free summer camping experience for kids who have or have had cancer. And next summer, we're expanding the joy of Camp Happy Times to include siblings of our patients!

The biggest challenge in 2023 has been in meeting the emergency needs of our families who have children fighting cancer, sickle cell disease and other blood disorders. Many parents have to stop or pause their jobs to take care of their children when they enter treatment. Our emergency support has doubled this year as we're now providing over \$250,000 in direct support to help with rent, food insecurity and other day to day needs. And we're proud to do it.

Help us do even more for our kids in New Jersey, Metro Philadelphia, New York City, and on Long Island by supporting our mission now and in the future. As always, we remain **all about the kids!**

Valerie Fund Grandparents Establish New Scholarship

Long before remote technology was ubiquitous, Helen and Barry Reiter's six-year-old grandson Aaron was lent a VGo robot by his Valerie Fund educational liaison. It was placed in his classroom so that he could participate in school and interact with his first-grade teacher and classmates from home. The Reiters were so impressed with the way the robot helped Aaron feel less isolated while he was on treatment for leukemia that they purchased an additional robot so more kids at his Morristown Valerie Fund Children's Center could benefit.

Ten years later, Aaron is a healthy 15-year-old high school sophomore in a STEM program and likes robotics. The Reiters are further expanding Valerie Fund patients' access to education by endowing a scholarship. The Helen and Barry Reiter Scholarship will be lifechanging for Valerie Fund kids pursuing medical or nursing school, offsetting the cost of the recipient's education by \$25,000 each year.

The Reiters said, "We are so grateful for everything The Valerie Fund did for Aaron and our family, so we've been thinking about how we can help."

The Valerie Fund Scholarship Program currently supports patients studying a vast array of disciplines, including medicine and nursing. Prioritizing medicine is a logical decision for the Reiters. Barry Reiter is a retired oncologist who set up practice in Morristown in 1974, coming from Memorial Sloan Kettering to New Jersey, where he and Helen, a retired nurse and nurse educator, would raise their three children. It would be several years before The Valerie Fund would bring pediatric oncology and hematology care to families in New Jersey. Coming full circle, the Helen and Barry Reiter Scholarship will help future Valerie Fund kids return to medicine as caregivers for kids just like themselves.
