# THE VALERIE FUND EDUCATIONAL SEMINAR, "PROMOTING RESILIENCE IN ADOLESCENTS AND YOUNG ADULTS"

Three Valerie Fund Psychologists, **Dara M. Steinberg, Ph.D.**, Columbia University Department of Pediatrics, **Heather Ginter, Psy.D.**, Atlantic Health System's Goryeb Children's Hospital, and **Natalie Nageeb, Psy.D.**, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia Cancer Center, came together along with Valerie Fund patient and MA candidate in Psychology, Montclair State University, **Willow DeFilippo**, to present on promoting resilience in adolescents and young adults this fall.

The seminar, held on October 24th at the Maplewood Country Club, was one in an occasional series The Valerie Fund sponsors to tap into the expertise of its network on topics that benefit The Valerie Fund and general community. This year's seminar drew health care and medical professionals, parents, grandparents, educators, and The Valerie Fund founders, Ed and Sue Goldstein.

Pediatric psychologists help children with chronic medical conditions address behavioral and emotional concerns, and are specifically trained to meet the needs of The

"Cancer at 11 years old and again at 18. How do you live the rest of your life when you've already been through that? Willow's insight is to practice radical acceptance. Fully accept the moment for what it is. You don't have the power to change it, you only have the ability to continue moving forward."

Valerie Fund children dealing with chronic illnesses such as cancer and other blood disorders. They do everything from helping kids adjust to new diagnoses, following different treatment regimens or doctor's instructions, helping families navigate the complex hospital systems, and helping facilitate communication between families and their medical teams. The panel addressed the developmental stages of adolescence and young adulthood; the confines of a pandemic and chronic illness; and highlighted resilience and post-traumatic growth, generating an engaging and interactive discussion.

Valerie Fund patient Willow DeFilippo moderated the question-and-answer session and provided the highlight of

the evening, speaking on their experiences with resilience and demonstrating post-traumatic growth as a Valerie Fund patient and two-time cancer survivor. Willow is one of the first Bieber Family scholars, and plans to pursue a PhD in Psychology.

Willow provided an educational and inspiring look into developing resilience from the perspective of a student of pediatric psychology, as well as a patient. They were diagnosed with Pre-B cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia at the age of 11 and again with ovarian cancer in 2020, their first year at college. Willow's presentation opened with a real-world example of developing resilience and what the human body and brain can cope with when learning and processing situations like learning how to drive a car.

"The Valerie Fund tries very hard to make sure your world does not shrink that much. When your world shrinks to just that hospital floor, they do everything they can to make sure you still experience everything," Willow explained, adding examples like wheeling the IV pole out to the courtyard to do the Coke and Mentos experiment. The Valerie Fund brought the world closer and ensured that there were plenty of good memories to live alongside the difficult memories of going through cancer twice.

# LETTER FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The year 2024 is shaping up to be another record-breaker year for the 6,000 children treated throughout The Valerie Fund network. For the very first time we will provide over \$4 million in funding for all the psychosocial programs across our eight Valerie Fund Children's Centers. This ensures that the psychologists and psychosocial teams that you read about in our cover story always have everything they need to provide a layer of healing for our children and their families. Willow DeFillipo said it perfectly, "The Valerie Fund tries very hard to make sure your world doesn't shrink that much."

Beyond the centers, Camp Happy Times expanded this summer by over 40% by inviting siblings to camp for the first time since 1982. Our scholarship program also set new highs with 127 scholarships totaling over \$620,000 awarded to our young adults attending college. The need for family financial support keeps growing. It almost doubled again this year, as we provided close to \$500,000 in emergency funding directly to our families through the social workers throughout our network.

This all happens because of the incredible support we get from individuals and corporations like Morgan Stanley, which allowed me to spend time this spring with our patients pictured here at Morgan Stanley Rec Day at Turtle Back Zoo. It also happens because each and every one of you understand the importance of what The Valerie Fund means to 6,000 children fighting cancer and blood

# **CHALLENGE FOR GOOD**

#### The Victor and Clara C. Battin Foundation



This past spring, a fundraising challenge by the Victor and Clara C. Battin Foundation unlocked more than \$200,000 from brand new donors in combination with its own \$100,000 gift. In fact, this was the third challenge the Battin Foundation

has issued to The Valerie Fund over the past four years, leveraging a total of a half million dollars for Valerie Fund programs and services.

The origin of this partnership began with the lifethreatening challenges of two families an ocean and decades apart. Italian Jews, the Battinos fled the Nazis in the middle of the night, changing their name to Battin, and ultimately moving to New York City. Patriarch Victor Battin was a businessman and artist.

One tenet of the Battin Foundation's mission was to protect children, and so when Battin trustee and Valerie Fund parent Matthew D'Amico suggested The Valerie Fund be a beneficiary, the family concurred. D'Amico's son Jonathan had been treated at the very first Valerie Fund Center at Overlook Hospital. With the family members' passings, we are proudly able to recognize their generosity by publishing their name. The Valerie Fund and the Victor and Clara C. Battin Foundation are now working together to form a future challenge that will issued to Valerie Fund donors in the first part of 2025.


